Background – School Sport Facilities

- Spaces for Sport - £2 million+ for 5 Primary Schools, MUGA's, Dance studio
- NOF – £4 million+ at 5 secondary schools, fitness centre, swimming pool upgrade, outdoor activity centre and MUGA's
- Two sports colleges and two school sport partnerships established in 2002 bringing in over £3 million
- £1.3 million Football Foundation for ATPs at Lees Brook and Derby Moor

Background – Continued

- PFI – Additional Sports Facilities at Merrill and da Vinci schools valued at £5 million
- Community Investment Fund – Additional Sports Facilities at Sinfin £3 million
- Woodlands and St. Benedicts – Additional ATPs, MUGA, sports hall and fitness suite valued around £6 million
- £700,000 fitness suite to open at Derby Moor
- Free Swimming Capital bid Woodlands £467k??

Challenges and Issues

- History
 - no traditional dual use sites
 - separate directorates – discussions taking place
 - trust status
 - PFI
- Infrastructure
 - no common booking / IT / management systems
 - FAST work not core funded
- Schools understanding value
 - dedicated resource
 - fear, protective
