3. Minutes of previous meeting

4. Matters Arising

JM provided minutes and update from the Recreation Strategy and Action Plan group within the PDNPA – **Attached action plan update, minutes of both Recreation Strategy and Health Benefits Groups.**

CN to send Leisure Hub documents providing an overview of the proposal.

EC gives update on PAYP mapping day where a number of organisations met to map out activities. Currently being collated by Derbyshire Young Peoples Services for circulation through EC to this group. Jackie Redfern from volunteer services could add to the mapping particularly the gaps in provision around the Hope Valley.

Discussion around the Olympic Torch relay around the country. Looking at own relay in High Peak through schools if no successful county bid.

5. Derbyshire Sport Update – County events calendar / including Jog Derbyshire

MB provides an update on county events calendar including looking at 6-10 major events that all partners in the county can support in-line with the Olympics. Looking at mass participation activities (walking / jogging / cycling) and having a launch in July “a year to go”. AC now working on narrowing the number of events down to a core few we can support and link to having a corporate element as well as mass participation and volunteering. Also promote other activities across the county through for example Active Derbyshire and more local promotion. List to be compiled in next month.

Update on cycling particularly led cycling programme, recreational, performance etc. Three development groups now in place in the county: Led Cycling (which links to British Cycling funding for developing women’s cycling), young peoples cycling pathway (links to Bike Ability, Smart Rider, Go Ride Clubs), Marketing of Cycling (consistent signage, routes, maps, websites, etc).

Active Derbyshire website competition around recording activity levels online and win prizes. Based on regular exercise 3 times a week with prize draws every 2 weeks for those logging the hours.

Olympic Legacy Fund announced “Places, People, Play”.

Places (90 million) – Nationally aim to upgrade up to 1000 sports clubs and facilities through 50 million investment, this could equate to approximately 20 clubs across Derbyshire. Invest 30 million in a small number of Iconic facilities based around multiple sports. 10 million allocated for protecting and improving hundreds of playing fields.

People (2 million) – Recruit, retain and deploy 40,000 sports leaders across the country over two years. This could equate to £20,000 per year to support 400 sports leaders in Derbyshire. This could link with the current volunteer network with funding driven through these mechanisms as they have the skills and capacity to work effectively with volunteers.

Play (40 million) – Deliver Gold Challenge a programme to encourage 100,000 adults to test themselves in multiple Olympic and Paralympics sports, this would equate to 2000 people across Derbyshire. Sportivate is a 32 million investment over 4 years to engage 300,000 14-25 years olds to take part in 6 weeks of coaching with 100,000 sustained. This equates to 6000 participants across Derbyshire, 1500 per year, 600 sustained for an investment of £163,000 per year. This could be an area of work that can be driven through the CSN, and should be an agenda item for the next meeting focused on the Back 2 Sport programme. Final element is 8 million invested in disability sport but no current indication of programmes, timescales or allocations.

Jog Derbyshire update by KN – **attached update with minutes**. Some success in engaging leisure facilities as part of Leisure Hub model. Possible

networking group in High Peak to be co-ordinated by KN. More info on the website.

6. Active People 4 results

CN / MB provide an update including success in High Peak around participation. Key areas of growth around participation:

- NI 8 increase from 22.3% - 24.7% over four years
- KPI 1 increase from 22.1% - 25.6% over four years
- KPI 2 increase from 3.9% - 4.5% over four years
- KPI 6 satisfaction from 62.5% - 69.7% over four years

7. Village Games update / Back 2 Sport programme – Emma Beswick

Attached Village Games update and Back 2 Sport figures. Overall very successful village games programme over the 7 months since the project started. EB is on track with her target figures for the year and now has an average throughput of 1000 attendances a month. EB and CN report on the success of the Back 2 Netball programme and family engagement project that both started in January.

Possibility of CSN funding being used to start new Back 2 projects or look at match funding other programmes like Sportivate. This to be on the agenda for next meeting. Need for targeting men through possibly football / cricket.

8. Leisure Hub Commissioning Service Update – CN / PB / AC

CN provides an update on the current situation with Hub Commissioning Model. All local authorities have received a draft contract for the provision of a range of community health services including:

- Exercise referral
- Walking for Health
- Childhood obesity prevention
- Weight Management

New contract and commissioning arrangements to be agreed and signed by April 1st. **Attached information on Leisure Hub project.**

9. Future Service Provision in the High Peak

CN gives update on HPBC service restructure with there likely to be a Leisure Services separate to other services currently under the banner of culture. Not clear what resources will sit within this new service structure other than a

service manager post to be appointed prior to the end of March, then the service will be developed around this.

DR provides update on HP SSP services and potential restructure with current funding for the SSP to run out in August. Plans being developed to continue to provide an SSP through a combination of funding sources and contributions from schools.

EM provides update on developing multi-agency teams to replace the current children and young people's service provision. 2 teams in Glossop, 1 in New Mills, 1 Team in Buxton, 1 Team in Hope Valley College. Locality manager lewie Hughes has been appointed with a remit for 0-19 family focus. MAT teams to each have a lead and will contain representatives across a range of services to engage young people and there families including a youth worker.

Need for these MAT teams to develop links with CSN and help to focus sports provision in local areas. Focus will be more targeted then universal engaging with young people identified as in more need. This will impact on the current Youth Service work.

JM reports there will be more focus from the PDNPA on adding value and strategic work rather than front line delivery.

EC reports that St Philip Howard have committed to retaining her post as community sports development officer although there will be a focus on internal development in the school.

10. AOB

RB reports funding from capacity builders through volunteer centre in Buxton, Umbrella, and Fariplay to run inclusion training around accessibility of sports provision with a supporting tool kit, more info to follow. Will be a link with CSN group to engage clubs etc. RB to link with EC, and James Cook.
