Contextualised Information:

Derbyshire has a population of 956,293 with the principal centre of population in the city of Derby, towards the South of the county, which has a population of 221,706. Other centres of population include Chesterfield, Matlock and Buxton. Much of the rest of the county is comprised of smaller towns and rural villages. The Peak District National Park in the North of the county covers a wide area but is generally sparsely populated.

Politically, the county operates on a two tier system with Derbyshire County Council and local Borough or District Council. Derby City Council is a Unitary Authority, entirely surrounded by Derbyshire. Two Local Education Authorities exist, each with officers dedicated to Physical Education. The remit of Derbyshire Sport, the County Sports Partnership, is across all Local Authorities in the county, including Derby City Council.

96% of the population of Derbyshire are classed as "White British", with 2.3% "Asian or Asian British". These figures change markedly when looking only at Derby City. Here, 8.4% of the population is classed as "Asian or Asian British", 1.8% as "mixed race", 1.8% as "Black" and 0.4% as "Chinese".



The PESSCL data collection for the 2006 – 2007 academic year shows 126,731 pupils in key stages 1 – 4 across the county (including Derby City). They pupils are educated in 509 state schools (including 60 secondary schools, 273 primary schools, 88 infant schools, 72 junior schools and 16 special schools).

There are 10 School Sport Partnerships across the county, including two within Derby City. The 2006 – 2007 PESSCL data shows that across the 8 Derbyshire Partnership 86% of pupils achieved two hours participation in high quality PE, 88% in the two Derby Partnerships. Leadership and volunteering is at 10% across the county, whilst School-Club links are at 29% in Derby City and 21% in Derbyshire.

Competition figures from the same PESSCL survey show that an average of 34.1% of pupils across Derbyshire (including Derby City) and throughout all Key Stages participated in inter-school competition on at least one occasion in 2006 – 2007. The figures for inter-school competition peak in Year 6, where 59.5% of pupils participated in inter-school competition across Derbyshire. The lowest competition figure was in Year 1 (19.8%). As a whole 27.7% of Key Stage 1 pupils participated in inter-school competition, 42.7% at Key Stage 2, 33.2% at Key Stage 3 and 25.9% at Key Stage 4.

The Derbyshire Schools Sports Association (DSSA) is a long-standing body within the county and is responsible for the provision of a number of county-wide competitions and for a number of Derbyshire representative teams. DSSA has been undergoing a comprehensive review since March 2007. This should be completed by May 2008 and will enable the Association to be re-launched. Through the review it is proposed to increase the operating budget of DSSA from approximately £10,000 at present to approximately £60,000. Over £20,000 of this funding will be re-distributed to local School Sports Associations to help fund increased levels of competition at local levels.

Strong links to National Governing Bodies (NGBs) are facilitated by the work undertaken by Derbyshire Sport. Through this work 12 local competition frameworks have been developed in conjunction with NGBs and in line with the National Competition Framework. The local frameworks provide a template for the development of competition in each of those 12 sports.

This Plan has been compiled through consultation with School Sport Partnerships, heads of PE, DSSA, local Schools Sports Associations, National Governing Bodies, Local Authority PE and School Sport Officers and Derbyshire Sport Officers of sport and



is designed to fit within these Competition Frameworks. It identifies six priority sports – athletics, cricket, dance, gymnastics, multi skill and orienteering. The developments identified in each of these sports will form part of local plans being developed with local partners. These local plans will also identify additional developments to be undertaken with local partners
